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<p>Would you like to make any comments or add any information to the summary of your organisation's past participation?</p>	<p>The university has a rich history of active engagement in international collaborations, exemplified by its membership in the Euroleague for Life Sciences since 2007. In this context, the university has consistently demonstrated its commitment to international cooperation through its involvement in the Socrates Erasmus program. Within this framework, the university has facilitated student exchanges with partner institutions in the EU, fostering a global perspective among its students. Furthermore, the Faculty of Agrobiolgy, Food and Natural Resources has undergone significant development, diversifying its focus beyond conventional agricultural education. This expansion includes addressing contemporary issues in natural resources management and food quality. Additionally, as the Coordinating Institution, Ondokuz Mayıs University and CZU have an existing Erasmus agreement. Under this mobility program, the project team members have engaged in reciprocal mobility activities, facilitating the mutual exchange of knowledge about their respective institutions, research domains, and infrastructure. Beyond collaborative research resulting in joint scientific publications, the project team has also successfully organized shared scientific events such as symposiums and conferences.</p>
